Broken ankle stops fighter from Tae Kwon-do upset

The Kwon-do is a version of an ancient form of unarmed combat, practised for many centuries in the Orient, in which competitors must stop their blows from actually hitting their opponents. But the sport is not without its painful side—as Toronto's Do Hee Lee, 1973 Pacific Tae Kwon-do champion, found out Saturday at Varsity Arena during the North American Open championships.

The 18-year-old 140-pounder beat Guy Filion of Montreal to win the black belt lightweight sparring title, then beat Daniel Richter, also of Montreal, in the black belt pattern championships before taking part in the team competition against top fighters from Washington, D.C. That's when the pain began for Lee. Lee sustained a deep facial cut in the team event, but went on to lose again to Marshall Collins, the 170-pound black belt heavyweight champion from Washington.
